CHANGES in the MASS PART 4

“Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.” The 1st phrase in the priest’s Invitation to Communion comes from John 1:29, *“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world,”* when John the Baptist heralds Christ’s arrival at the River Jordan. John the Gospel writer applies Lamb of God to Christ, which has two Old Testament references. The first comes from prophet Isaiah’s fourth suffering servant song (Is 53). The innocent pure lamb suffers death for the sins of many. The second draws from Exodus 11-13. The Lord protects the Jewish people with the sprinkling of the Lamb’s blood on the doorpost from the angel of death. Further, the eating of the Lamb as part of the Passover meal would become a meal of liberation from the slavery under the Egyptians. Our Eucharistic Lord as the sacrificial lamb protects us and gives us the liberation meal of Calvary, the victory over evil. In addition, this invitation reminds us that the Eucharist is not an ordinary meal. The priest calls the people to accept the invitation given by the angels for the heavenly marriage supper of the Lamb in Revelation 19:9.

The people’s response *Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.* The 1st half comes directly from Matthew 8:8, in which the faith-filled centurion begs Jesus to heal his paralyzed servant. This conveys humanity’s unworthiness because of sin, and our need for sincere humility before receiving the Holy Eucharist. Furthermore, the reception of the Eucharist is a moment for God to grace us to dwell within our souls. The last half recalls that the Eucharist provides spiritual nourishment. As the Eucharist strengthens our souls, the Eucharist also heals us mentally, emotionally and physically.
