Deacon's Corner:

MASS WHILE ON THE ROAD

I certainly hope we are all enjoying the summertime and all the activities that come along with our beachside community and all the events that come with the time of year.

My family always enjoys the time in Santa Barbara, but we also enjoy getting away from work and our responsibilities for a week or more each year. This usually entails travel to another town; and one of our favorite events is visiting the local Parish, wherever we may be.

I encourage all travelers to not forget to attend Mass on the weekends where ever your travels may take you. Be advised; although Catholic services are all the same, in the matter that we all read the same readings, use the same prayer options, and generally sing similar hymns that we are usually familiar with, the services are not always the exact same. The people may stand and kneel at slightly different times, lectors and ministers may have different functions, the sign of peace may or may not be a social encounter, and of course you never know the route of the Communion procession. My advice is not to sit in front pew, nor be the first to respond to a prayer or stand up during the Eucharistic Prayer; you're

bound to draw some friendly but questionable gazes, when you realize they stand after the Amen. None of this is wrong or incorrect, just different. Each Bishop has some rights to alter the Liturgy as he feels may be necessary for his particular diocese.

Just always remember, the true Christian isn't concerned about getting all the prayers perfect or standing up in orchestrated unison, or being concerned if we sing all 5 verses or just 2 of the entrance song. We come to the Mass to give thanks and praise to Jesus and our Heavenly Father. We come to Mass to experience the Holy Spirit working within us and the Christian community joined in worship, and to partake in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

I hope we always take time to get away from the daily grinds of our jobs and responsibilities to enjoy some personal time and relaxation, which should always include the relaxation and re-energizing time of attending weekly Mass, where ever our travels may take us.

Sixteen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for May to order at 7:33 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The Minutes of the April meeting were approved as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- The Third Degree Exemplification on April 26 was a huge success and the Grand Knight thanked all who were involved.

Help Stop Diabolical Bill That Would Force Pro-life Clinics to Help Kill Babies

Anyone who doesn't believe in the devil should look at AB 775, a bill now making its way through our state legislature in Sacramento.

Not content with keeping abortions legal and making us taxpayers pay for them, anti-life lawmakers might soon pass AB 775. This bill would force all baby-saving pro-life medical clinics to tell pregnant mothers they can have their unborn babies killed, free of charge, through Medi-Cal.

If the pro-life clinic refused to tell the moms about this deadly option, it'd be fined \$500 for the first "offense" and \$1,000 for every additional "offense." For example, Los Angeles Pregnancy Services (LAPS), which saved 403 babies from the abortionists last year, would've had to pay \$402,500 in fines!

No pro-life clinic could pay such massive fines. The goal of AB 775, obviously, is to force every pro-life clinic in the state to close its doors, so the abortionists can kill untold thousands more babies and rake in millions more dollars. How Satan must be cackling at the prospect of forcing pro-life Christians to take part in baby-murder or go out of business!

The State Assembly has already voted in favor of this monstrosity, and the State Senate was scheduled to vote on it by the time you read this. If the Senate voted "yes," then the bill would go to Gov. Brown to be signed into law.

We Knights and our families must take a stand NOW against the evil of AB 775.

Fifteen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for June to order at 7:35 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The Minutes of the May meeting were approved as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- This is the second year in which Brothers Steve Romofsky and Ray Charpentier have attended the Knights State Convention. He urged all fellow Knights to attend if they have the opportunity because the speakers and friendships make it an uplifting experience.
- Our annual Officers' Installation Gala will still be held June 20 at the Old Mission Santa Barbara. The Latin Mass will be held in the Serra Chapel at 9:00 followed by the installation of officers at 10:00 after some discussion regarding Council 5300's participation. All Officers on the slate must make arrangements to be there or have another Knight take their place. A pancake breakfast will follow the installation in Serra Hall at 11:00.
- The May 27 Scholarship Dinner was a huge success with 106 attendees. Brother Bruce Garcia was lauded greatly for his outstanding organization and preparation. Many thanks to all who helped and attended.

Under the Treasurer's Report, the Treasurer had an excused absence.

The Financial Secretary reported eleven bills paid. The Council's income was \$710: \$415 from the scholarship dinner, \$140 from the bar, and \$155 from the 50-50 raffle. The food expense was \$594.16, resulting in a profit to the Council of \$115.85.

Under Membership, there was nothing to report.

Under Communication, there was no new communication.

- The 2015-2016 Council Budget was amended following discussion and prior to the second reading. A motion was made and discussed to increase the St. Vincent de Paul Summer Camp amount from \$850 to \$1275 to reflect the true cost of providing this experience to three youngsters. The motion was discussed and passed unanimously. The Amended budget was then given the first reading.
- Brother Ray Charpentier asked if all of the calling Committee Captains wanted to continue calling. No one wished to be excused.

Under New Business,

- Brother Mark Weitstock left the sign-up sheet for participation in our 2015 Fiesta fundraiser at McKenzie Park. This year's booth will be open from August 5 through August 8. Brother Mark completed all of the paperwork and our new trailer is ready to go. All Knights are welcomed to participate. Please contact Grand Knight Steve Romofsky or Brother Mark Weitstock for more information.
- A resolution was proposed for the purpose of donating \$3000 to the Knights Ultrasound project to protect babies in utero. There was then a motion to amend the resolution to the effect that the Council should use any surplus funds from the Council's budget for the 2014-2015 Columbian year be applied to this purpose and then treat the remaining amount needed as a loan. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The resulting Resolution reads as follows:
*WHEREAS the Council has determined that it wants to support the efforts of PDD Mike Ohler to secure funding for mobile ultrasound pregnancy services in the Southern California region within the 2014-2015 Columbian year, and
WHEREAS the Council's efforts to raise a total of \$3,000 for this purpose are*

proceeding more slowly than hoped, IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED that: 1) any surplus funds remaining in the Council's budget for the 2014-2015 Columbian year be dedicated to this purpose, and 2) any remaining funds needed to meet the Council's total commitment of \$3,000 be transferred from the Council's Building and Equipment Fund, to be treated as a "loan" from the same Fund, and subsequently reimbursed from continued fundraising in the 2015-2016 Columbian year, until all funds advanced from the Building and Equipment Fund for this purpose are reimbursed in full.

The Resolution was given the first reading.

Under the District Deputy's report, Ray Centeno, Jr. spoke highly of Council 1684 at this last business meeting under his guidance. He introduced the incoming District Deputy Tim Coe and gave him the opportunity to give the Council an insight into his background. Brother Ray also requested that Knights think about attending the World Series of Special Olympics this summer. There will be a Chapter meeting on June 23 that our Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight should attend. District Deputy Ray will officiate at our Officers' Installation festivities.

Under the Field Agent's report, Brother David Nordella was unable to attend.

Under the Good of the Order,

- Outgoing, but not yet gone, Worthy Grand Knight Steve Romofsky requested a standing ovation for Brothers Ray Charpentier, Bruce Garcia, John Green, and Mark Weitstock for their outstanding service to the Council.

Following a closing prayer by Worthy Grand Knight Steve Romofsky, the Council meeting for June adjourned at 8:03 p.m.




INSTALLATION CEREMONY—SATURDAY, JUNE 20, 2015




