# EIGHTEEN NEW PRO-LIFE WOMEN IN CONGRESS WILL BE A FORCE FOR THE UNBORN BABIES

ny time a <u>pro-abortion</u> woman gets elected to public office, the news media love to tell us about it. But on November 3, when the voters elected a record 18 (!) new <u>pro-life</u> Congresswomen, the Big Media suddenly got acute laryngitis. That's because they want the American people to think all women are pro-

abortion. They don't want us to know a big new wave of pro-life women is about to slam into the anti-lifers in the House of Representatives.

The new pro-life women who are heading to Washington are Stephanie Bice (Oklahoma); Lauren Boebert (Colorado); Kat Cammack (Florida); Michelle Fischbach (Minnesota); Diana Harshbarger (Tennessee); Yvette Herrell (New Mexico); Ashley Hinson (Iowa); Young Kim (California); Nancy Mace (South Carolina); Nicole Malliotakis (New York); Lisa McClain (Michigan); Mary Miller (Illinois); Mariannette Miller-Meeks (Iowa); Maria Elvira Salazar (Florida); Victoria Spartz (Indiana); Michelle Steel (California); Marjorie Taylor Greene (Georgia); and Beth Van Duyne (Texas).

For Congresswoman-Elect Kat Cammack, the right to life is personal. She told Fox News that 32 years ago her mother refused to abort her, even though doctors and family members urged her to. She said that on Capitol Hill she'll protect the unborn babies just as her mother did (LifeNews, December 3, 2020).

The incoming Representative said she'll tell her personal story to Congress and urge pregnant mothers to let their babies live. She also plans to confront legislators who favor the killing of unborn babies.

"We'll classify bacteria on Mars as life, but we won't classify a heartbeat in the womb as life," she explained. "Or if you look at the [Justice Department], if a pregnant woman is murdered, it's a double homicide. But if the woman chooses to terminate that pregnancy, it's not. It's very hypocritical from the government standpoint. As a federal representative coming in, I want to address that hypocrisy in our government."

Let's pray that God gives courage and eloquence to these 18 new pro-life women lawmakers.






## "KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS" POSTER CONTEST DECEMBER 2020



## United States Conference Catholic Bishops President Calls Blessed McGivney "Model" for Clergy Archbishop Gómez, president of USCCB, and Archbishop Pierre Call on Blessed McGivney's Intercession During Trying Times

hurch leaders at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) first ever virtual assembly highlighted Blessed Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, as a "model and intercessor for our own ministries."

"He was a pastor in a time of moral confusion and social unrest. Just as we are," said Archbishop José Gómez of Los Angeles, president of the USCCB. "Like us, he was a priest called to minister in a pandemic. In fact, he gave his life during the flu pandemic of 1890, one of more than 1 million who died worldwide."

Archbishop Gómez, a member of the Knights, spoke extensively about the K of C founder in his presidential address during the assembly, describing Blessed McGivney's beatification as a "beautiful moment in the history of the American Church."



Blessed McGivney was officially declared "blessed" by a

Vatican decree during a Mass held at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Conn. The beatification Mass followed five months after Pope Francis issued a decree on May 27 attributing a miracle to the intercession of Blessed McGivney. The miracle involved the healing of Michael "Mikey" Schachle from fetal hydrops, which causes a fatal accumulation of fluids throughout the body of an unborn child.

Archbishop Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the U.S., told assembly attendees that Blessed McGivney "understood the challenges" of those communities he served, but was able to "animate the lay apostolate" by founding the Knights of Columbus.

"His authoritative witness shows forth the face of the Samaritan church, unwilling to pass by someone in need but willing to see where compassion is needed and to act," Archbishop Pierre said. "There is a five-year-old boy who, through Father McGivney's intercession was cured of fetal hydrops and now who can look forward in hope to the life that lies ahead. May the Blessed Michael McGivney intercede for you in offering to your flocks the witness of hope."

Archbishop Gómez echoed the apostolic nuncio's message, adding the historical context in which Blessed McGivney lived as a time of anti-immigrant intolerance, poverty as well as discrimination against Catholics.

"Father McGivney met these injustices by living the Gospel," he said. "Love was not an abstraction or a cause for him; it was the widow and the orphan, the father with no job; the prisoner on death row. Blessed Michael McGivney knew their faces and knew their names."

Amid challenges facing the Church, Archbishop Gómez called on the attendees to follow Blessed McGivney's "courageous example" and "weep now with those who are weeping."

"This is our mission in this moment. To continue to bring healing and hope to the people of our time," he continued. "As we go forward, let us ask for the prayers of Blessed Michael McGivney. May he help us to bring people to a new encounter with Jesus Christ. Who loves us and offers his Body and Blood for us."

Blessed McGivney's liturgical memorial will be observed annually on Aug. 13, the day between his birth (Aug. 12) and death (Aug. 14).
