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

**General Meeting of Council 1684

DID JESUS GIVE US THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET TO ATONE FOR ABORTIONS?

You and your family probably pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, venerate the Divine Mercy Image, and celebrate the incredible Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter), when all our sins can be forgiven and all our temporal punishment be eliminated (including Purgatory).

But did you know the main reason why Jesus gave the Divine Mercy Chaplet to St. Faustina might be abortion? Fr. Chris Alar, who promotes the Divine Mercy message, thinks so.

In the Saint's famous *Diary* (#1276), she says, "At eight o'clock, I was seized with such violent pains that I had to go to bed at once. I was convulsed with pain for three hours; that is, until eleven o'clock at night. At times, the pains that caused me to lose consciousness. Jesus had me realize that in this way, I took part in His Agony in the garden, and that He Himself allowed these sufferings in order to offer reparation to God for the souls murdered in the wombs of mothers. If only I could save even one soul from murder by means of these sufferings!"

"One day," the Saint also reveals, "Jesus told me that He would cause a chastisement to fall upon the most beautiful city in our country. I saw the great wrath of God and a shudder pierced my heart. Jesus said to me, 'My child, unite yourself closely to Me during the Sacrifice of the Mass and offer My Blood and My Wounds to My Father in expiation for the sins of that city.'"

The Saint told Bl. Michael Sopoćko, her confessor, that God would destroy the city due to "the crimes committed there, especially...the massacre of infants not yet born, as the most grievous crime of all." The city was Warsaw, which Fr. Sopoćko said was a "very prominent center for providing abortions, and abortions were usually performed there between the hours of 8:00 and 11:00 p.m.—the exact time St. Faustina said she had those abdominal pains."

On September 13, 1935, the Saint wrote, she saw that God's wrath was about to strike the earth: "I began to implore the Angel to hold off for a few moments. But my plea was a mere nothing in the face of the Divine anger. ... [Then] I found myself pleading with God for the world with words [the Chaplet] I heard interiorly.

"As I was praying in this manner, I saw the angel's helplessness. He could not carry out the just punishment, which was rightly due for sins. Never before had I prayed with such inner power as I did then. The next morning, when I entered chapel, I heard these words interiorly: Every time you enter the chapel, immediately recite the prayer [the Chaplet] which I taught you yesterday." GOD IS LIKE A HELPLINE

Every night before bed, I say ten or more things that I am grateful for and five things that I pray for like how the Israelites kept losing faith in God. I continue to do the same thing. During the pandemic, this mistake really affected me. I was praying devoutly, and especially praying for my 99 year old great grandma. The last time I saw her was heartbreaking. She was bedridden, and didn't know who I was. I wasn't praying that she would stay alive, but that she would leave, and be with God. Then I stopped praying as much. When she got covid, and died, I felt a sad relief. I was devastated that she was gone, but I knew that it was time. I also felt guilty, because although it wasn't my fault, I felt a responsibility for it. The same thing happened with my dog. He had an aggressive bone cancer in his mouth. The vet said back in September that he had about three months to live. I prayed every day that he would stay, and he did. Again, I stopped praying, and in early March, we had to put him down. This time, I felt a different type of guilt. I felt like I could have spent more time with him. I felt like it wasn't time.

God really helped me have the strength to push through it. At first, I was so angry with God for let-

ting this happen, but then I put the burden upon myself. I felt like it was my fault for these deaths. Another thing I felt was that my problems and feelings weren't valid. I felt and feel that because I am a privileged white person in America, I should be grateful, and not complain about anything. But, I also know that God doesn't look for that, he looks to who we are as a person and helps us through our emotions. When I pray, I imagine my guardian angel above me. I have started to think that it is my great grandmother, because I have felt her with me after she died This helped me understand that she will always be with me.

From these experiences, I learned that what you put into God, you get out of God. I know that I will continue to make this mistake because I am human. But I also know that God is waiting for me when I pray. He is waiting there listening to me, comforting me, understanding me. I learned that I am able to be with God, and put my trust in God but I have to stay with God through the good and the bad. Every time I am in a good place in my life, I think that I don't need God, and when I am in a bad place, that is when I reach out to God, I think of it like God is a helpline. You call on him in times of need, but you need to keep it close, and make sure that you have it in good condition, like your relationship with God. ♦

TRUSTING GOD

Throughout this year thousands of people have gone through hard things, especially being at home has made people feel isolated and desperate for change.

This was how I felt at the beginning of this new society we are in. During the beginning of all this it was very hard for me to get used to change and I quickly started to feel very unmotivated. Later on I started to pray to God and reflect. I hadn't noticed how I felt about my grandpa's passing, until I took the time to do this. I wasn't very close to my grandpa, but after his death I felt very guilty about not spending time with him while he was still here. I still do sometimes but when I start to feel disappointed or mad at myself I start to pray and reflect.

I knew my grandpa was in a bad condition and even now I question, why did he leave us so early? Why couldn't God have waited a little longer, given my family and I more time to spend with him? With the help and trust of God I've learned to endure this without feeling guilt.

Something I've learned through this experience is to not take advantage of the time I have with my family. This past year I've also learned to cherish the time I have with friends. Like I had mentioned before, at the beginning of this new way of living and not being able to see the people I saw on a daily basis, was very challenging and difficult for me.

I felt like I had achieved less and was very unmotivated. With the help of God, asking for courage, and praying to our Blessed Mother, I learned to endure it. I have to admit that I still feel unmotivated sometimes but praying helps me feel more better and calm with myself. I've been fortunate enough to be able to return to school in person as things slowly start to get better.

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NEW FAVORS REPORTED THROUGH FATHER MCGIVNEY'S HELP

Since the K of C founder's beatification in October 2020, faithful around the world continue to report answered prayers due to his intercession

Father Michael J. McGivney's role in the miraculous healing of Michael "Mikey" Schachle from fetal hydrops was recognized last May by Pope Francis. The Holy Father then officially declared the Knights of Columbus founder Blessed by an apostolic letter that was read at the Mass of beatification Oct. 31, 2020. Father McGivney's beatification brings him one step closer to the declaration of his sainthood and affirms his role as an intercessor for the prayers of the faithful.

In recent months, Catholics around the world have reported favors linked to Blessed Michael McGivney's intercession. The website of the Father Michael J. McGivney Guild keeps a list of those favors, ranging from COVID-19 recoveries to finding new employment to apparently miraculous healings, and more.

Here is a sample of recently reported favors:

Knight Recovers from COVID-19

"A member of our K of C council (11237) became severely ill with COVID-19 and was on the verge of requiring intubation to be placed on a ventilator. We organized Knights across the state of Oklahoma to begin praying the rosary together for him on Zoom, followed by the Blessed Michael McGivney prayer, with the intention being his recovery.

After we started these prayers, his oxygen levels improved and he is now out of ICU. His doctor told him it is nothing short of a miracle that he survived an illness of this severity." — *Resident of Edmond, Okla. (submitted March 5, 2021)*

Nephew Recovering from COVID-19

"My nephew, Andrew, developed a very serious case of COVID-19. He was in the hospital for over eight weeks and was very close to death. I said the Blessed Michael McGivney Novena twice, and as I started the third time, Andrew left the hospital and went into rehab. He is now home and doing well. I truly believe that God, with the intercession of Blessed Father McGivney, saved Andrew's life." — *Resident of Manalapan, N.J. (submitted Jan. 26, 2021)*

Employment Opportunity

"My wife's work situation was causing her added stress because she was being asked to take additional duties that she was never trained or hired to do. She and a co-worker applied for the same position with a different employer. I prayed the novena and prayer for Father McGivney's beatification for my wife's work situation to improve and for her to be hired for the position she applied for. Yesterday, October 29, on Day 8 of the novena, my wife was hired at the new employer with a small increase in pay! She starts her new position on November 16." — *Resident of Rio Rico, Ariz. (submitted Oct. 31, 2020)*

Recovery After a Heart Attack

“I heard that an acquaintance suffered a heart attack and was in the hospital. Upon hearing the news, I prayed to Father McGivney and continued praying the next several days. Then I asked a friend if she had heard any news, and she said that the family was saying goodbyes and withdrawing life support. I returned home and prayed again to Father McGivney for a miraculous recovery and comfort to her husband and three children. The next day, I received an email that she was awake and they had prayed over her with a relic of Father McGivney.” — *Resident of West Hartford, Conn. (submitted Dec. 11, 2020)*

Healing of My Son

“Around 1 a.m. this morning, I was awakened by my wife’s loud voice, saying that our second son’s body temp reached an astonishing 40 deg C (104 F) and he also vomited twice. She gave one dose of paracetamol and 30 minutes later, she fell asleep. I extended my right hand to our son and touched his forehead. I offered a prayer and asked for Blessed Michael McGivney’s intercession to heal our son. When my wife woke up around 8 a.m. to check his condition, she was surprised that his fever was gone entirely.” — *Resident of Panabo City, Davao del Norte, Philippines (submitted Nov. 15, 2020)*

A Successful Ultrasound Project

“Council 4877 successfully raised over \$23,000 for an ultrasound machine for the Charis Pregnancy Help Center in Fond du Lac, Wisc. The miraculous part was that it was completed in fewer than five months, ending the last week of October 2020. The members of our council used the Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney to ask for his intercession for our project. Donations ranged in amounts from \$20 to a single donation of \$15,000 by a local couple. Many Wisconsin K of C councils and local residents contributed to the cause. Thanks be to God!” — *Resident of Wipon, Wisc. (submitted Dec. 15, 2020)*

Cured Throat Cancer

“In the fall of 2019, David informed all of us that he had contracted Stage 4 throat cancer and his doctors told him that he had maybe six months to live since the cancer was discovered so late in the process. It was during a family Zoom visitation on Christmas Day that Dave gave us all the very exciting news that his doctors have told him that he somehow (they claim that they do not know how) no longer has any active cancer cells actively attacking his body at this time. Many Knights have been praying for David for many months now.” — *Resident of Norwalk, Calif. (submitted Dec. 27, 2020)*

Help in Hotel Industry During Pandemic

“I work in the hotel industry. With the new government regulations, we missed being allowed to operate as a quarantine hotel. It had a huge impact on our team’s livelihoods. I prayed to Father McGivney for help that we may be considered. Yesterday, my prayer was answered — we have been added and accepted as a quarantine hotel. Of note, Father McGivney’s feast day is the same as my birthday; he was an immigrant, so am I; he died during a pandemic, and he has answered my prayer during a pandemic. I truly believe that Father McGivney has been instrumental in interceding and allowing my prayer to be answered.” — *Resident of Hong Kong (submitted Jan. 19, 2021)*

Pain Relief

“I had pain in my left leg for a long time. I talked to my doctor about it, but nothing was done. After years of complaining, I was referred to a specialist who could not find anything wrong, but the pain did not go away. I prayed to Blessed Michael McGivney and the pain went away. This was before Father Michael was elevated to “blessed.” I thank Father McGivney and God for this favor.” — *Resident of Florida (submitted Jan. 26, 2021)*

Helping a Seminarian

“I am a seminarian from the Philippines. Since I was a child, I have heard about Father Michael. When I was about to enter the seminary, I asked his kind intercession so that I may pass the entrance exam and after many days, the seminary said that I passed. He helped me, he interceded for me, and I chose him as my patron.” — *Resident of the Philippines (submitted Feb. 25, 2021)*
