

## CLERGY OF THE MONTH

### FRANCISCAN SISTERS OF THE SACRED HEART

This is a new bulletin feature honoring our clergy and fostering the virtues to which they are dedicated. Each month we will select an order in Santa Barbara and give a history of their special works of charity and the ideals they uphold. We hope you like this series. For this first month I have chosen a group close to me, the Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred Heart. I work with members of this order in my job, an aunt was a member of the order, and several relatives have worked closely with them at St. Francis Hospital.

In 1866 at Seelbach, Germany, Father Wilhelm Berger founded a group of women modeled after St. Francis of Assisi and St. Vincent de Paul and dedicated to the pursuit of holiness through works of neighborly love. They were to be “Sisters of Mercy, Joyous and Poor”. The sisters cared for the needs of the poor, for the sick in their homes, for victims of typhoid and smallpox epidemics raging in the area, for orphans’ homes and schooling, and for the elderly. The order earned the Iron Cross for nursing soldiers on the battlefield. However, Chancellor Bismarck ordered the sisters to disband or leave Germany. So, Mother Anastasia Bischler led a pilgrim band of sisters to Indiana, where many German immigrants fleeing religious persecution were settling, then on to Illinois, California, and Brazil. In California, the sisters located in San Francisco, Santa Barbara, and Los Angeles. The sisters were invited to Santa Barbara by Fr. Michael Reichardt O.F.M. to provide hospital care. In 1908, the sisters started by purchasing for \$23,000 the Quisisana Sanitarium and renamed it St. Francis Hospital. They began to expand services immediately, adding a surgical wing in 1910, and culminating in a new 100 bed facility opened in 1923. But that dream was shattered by the earthquake of July 29, 1925, which destroyed the entire structure. However, not one patient was injured. The sisters set up tents on the property and finding the statue of the Sacred Heart unscathed amid the rubble, saw a sign of God’s will to rebuild. With the sisters’ faith and courage arousing the community’s support, a new hospital opened in August 1927. As before, the sisters have continually expanded to serve the community needs. They established a school of nursing, a clinic for the poor, made large building additions in 1956 and 1984, and many area remodels for expanded services and new technology. In 2000, St. Francis Medical Center was sold to Catholic Healthcare West, and now, due to the pressures on the healthcare industry, the hospital is for sale. The statue of the Sacred Heart still stands at the hospital.

During almost 100 years of presence in Santa Barbara, the Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred Heart have truly been “Sisters of Mercy, Joyous and Poor”. Three sisters now live at the convent at the hospital and work in the hospital, at the associated retirement home, and at St. Vincent de Paul school. The sisters’ motherhouse is at 9201 West St. Francis Rd., Frankfort, Illinois, 60423 where 37 retired sisters live. About 130 members of their order are working in Illinois, Indiana, California, Brazil, and Belize.

**Financial Secretary's Report  
16 December 2002– 15 January 2003**



The council recorded expenses of \$1,868.50 and income of \$6,091.55 during the December 16, 2002 through January 15, 2003 period. In addition to normal expenses for office supplies, copying, and meeting refreshments, the 10 expense items included \$310 to the City of Goleta for Stow Grove reservations for Memorial Day and Labor Day; \$323.36 for food and \$121.78 for decorations for the Christmas party; \$264.50 in per capita assessment by Supreme; \$160.55 for printing the December bulletin; \$100 to Catholic Charities; and \$315 to St. Raphael's SPIRIT for ads in the Christmas edition. These ads included our regular ad, three Third degree photos, and five Fourth degree photos. The assembly has already reimbursed the council for the Fourth degree photos.

Income included \$1,061 from the Christmas party; \$149.44 from the assembly as reimbursement for food for a Fourth degree dinner; \$175 reimbursement from the assembly for photos in the SPIRIT; \$356 proceeds from the 29 December breakfast; \$166.75 from Keep Christ in Christmas card sales; and \$4,166.86 in member payments. The member payments include \$389.86 for the 365 club (Columbian Charities).

The council lost one member and gained one member during this period. On 30 December, Frank Lynch transferred to Council 6145 in Newton, PA. Those who knew Frank remember him as an energetic knight. We wish him well. At the 13 January business meeting, Terry Sliger introduced Leonard Cruess, who is transferring in from Council 1684. Brother Cruess is an honorary life member. Membership remains at 198.

The attendance prize went unclaimed at the January business meeting since Bernie Jochum whose name was called was absent. The February business meeting attendance prize will be \$50.




He can occasionally be seen at our social functions with his digital camera, taking pictures for our future articles.



Vatican calls Catholic politicians into line

VATICAN CITY, Jan 16 (Reuters) - The Vatican told Catholic politicians on Thursday they must oppose laws on abortion, euthanasia and gay marriages and can not accept compromises on Church teachings when formulating policy or legislation. The instructions were contained in new guidelines, which the Vatican said it was publishing now because recent "unsettling" scientific advances, such as embryo research, and social changes had made it necessary to clarify the Church's position again. The document, called "Doctrinal Note on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life," also turned the screws on Catholic publications, saying they could not put forward different views for the sake of pluralism. The guidelines, which reaffirm traditional Church teachings, said Catholic politicians had to be reminded of them because of confusion that developed over Catholic doctrine. The 17-page document said Catholics in political life "cannot compromise" in the name of tolerance, pluralism or freedom of choice when making or supporting legislation. "Democracy must be based on the true and solid foundation of non-negotiable ethical principles, which are the underpinning of life in society," said the document by the Vatican's doctrinal department, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. "Those who are directly involved in lawmaking bodies have a grave and clear obligation to oppose any law that attacks human life. For them, as for every Catholic, it is impossible to promote such laws or to vote for them," it said.

**NO RECOGNITION FOR SAME-SEX MARRIAGE**

The document, specifically approved by Pope John Paul, called for laws protecting the family, which it said had to be "based on monogamous marriage between a man and a woman, and protected in its unity and stability..." "In no way can other forms of cohabitation be placed on the same level as marriage, nor can they receive legal recognition as such," it added. The Vatican is firmly opposed to recent moves aimed at legally recognizing same-sex marriages in several European countries and in North America. The Netherlands has recognized registered gay partnerships since 1998 and it passed laws allowing same-sex couples to marry and adopt children in December 2000. Several other European countries have given gays rights just short of those enjoyed by heterosexual married couples. Asserting that fundamental moral laws were at stake, the document restated the Church's opposition to abortion and euthanasia and urged respect for the rights of the human embryo. In an apparent reference to the dangers of cloning -- which the Church rejects along with stem-cell embryo research -- the document warned of potential laws that are "heedless of the consequences for the existence and future of human beings (and) attack the very inviolability of human life." It also criticized Catholic organizations and publications in some countries for taking "ambiguous or incorrect" stands. Such bodies could not support political forces or movements with positions contrary to the teaching of the Church on ethical questions, the document said.






