Stewardship





Soften the pangs that still revenge thy doom;
Nor from the dark abyss of nature's womb,
Where back I cast thee, let revolving time
Call up past scenes to aggravate my crime,
Two adverse tyrants ruled thy wayward fate,
Thyself a helpless victim to their hate;
Love, spite of honour's dictates, gave thee breath;
Honour, in spite of love, pronounced thy death.

Few issues generate as much heat in the United States as the debate over abortion -- the subject of a powerful and graphic new documentary by controversial British filmmaker Tony Kaye.

"Lake of Fire," currently on limited release in the United States, unwinds over more than two and a half hours of interviews with some of the leading figures from the pro-life and pro-choice camps.

But it is the graphic and disturbing depiction of termination procedures, filmed like the rest of the movie in black and white, that marks the film out.

"From the moment I started making the film I thought I have to show an abortion, which at the time had never been done before," Kaye, best known for his 1998 neo-Nazi feature "American History X," told AFP in an interview.

"There was no question about whether or not that was the right thing to do because if I'm documenting two sides of the argument, that is one side of the argument and you have to show it," he said.

Kaye, who cut his teeth directing commercials and music videos, separately admits to being "addicted to controversy when I began."

One scene depicts a doctor sifting through a surgical tray after performing a late-term abortion, where the grisly residue of an arm, a foot and part of a face can be clearly made out.

"It's about as shocking as any motion picture can ever get. It's illegal to film someone being killed," said Kaye.

They may be the kind of images used by anti-abortion activists, but Kaye also doesn't shy from showing pictures of a kneeling and bent-over naked woman who died after performing a botched abortion on herself with a wire coat hanger.

Kaye worked for more than 15 years on "Lake of Fire" -- anti-abortion activist John Burt's description of the hell awaiting abortionists -- and said his goal when he set out was simply to show both sides of the argument.

"The concept was to make a film about the debate over the issue of abortion but to make it a non-propagandist way and to create a kind of war of words."

He said he wanted "to create this kind of a weave where we really explore the issue without taking any sides."

"It's very easy for me to do that because... I don't really have a point of view. I'm not a politician or a commentator," he said.

**Musical Group, 'Blest and Broken' Shares Their
New Release with the Community**

The seven siblings from the talented Stawiecki (pronounced Stah-vyeh-tskee) Family shared their newly released album at the Knights of Columbus Dinner Social on Monday evening, Oct. 29 in the St. Raphael Parish Hall.

Many parishioners at St. Raphael's and members of the Knights of Columbus have heard this incredible music group (vocals, guitars, bass, percussion) at the Saturday Vigil Mass (Jan. 2006 until March 2007) and at other parish events.

Comprised of seven of the 11 children of Ryszard and Maria Jolanta Stawiecki, the group is now known as 'Blest and Broken.' They include Agnieszka 33, Katarzyna (Kasia) 30, Karolina 25, Virginia 24, Anna 22, Ivona 21 and Gabriel 20. Kasia explained their namesake thus, "We thought about what it means to be followers of Christ, and it hit us - Blest and Broken. These two words are very profound. At first glance, they appear to be opposites, but upon closer inspection, the words have a special relationship which point directly to Christ. This happens when people start to ponder the different meanings of the word broken. Of course, it is a separating into parts. But for what purpose? In the case of our loving Savior, it was a breaking of His body so that we may share in the promise of salvation." Her older sister Agnieszka added, "We hope that those who hear 'Blest and Broken' are immediately reminded of the Last Supper and the breaking of the bread. Jesus is the Bread of Life which was blest and broken for our sake. As His followers, we too are called to 'take up our cross' or to be broken - for the sake of our

brothers and sisters. Kasia further expressed, "We all face many challenges and struggles. At times, we feel forgotten, lost and broken. But at the same time, we know that such trials bring us closer to Christ, because it is in suffering that we most resemble Christ."

Many parishioners who attended Saturday Vigil Mass at St. Raphael's asked if they had a CD they could buy. "That inspired us to record one," stated Karolina. In July they released their first exceptional CD, "We Remember," featuring 13 of the songs they performed at Mass. These titles are:

- 1 - Gather Us Together;
- 2 - Prayer of St. Francis;
- 3 - There Is a Longing;
- 4 - Lead Me, Lord;
- 5 - Mary's Song;
- 6 - We Remember;
- 7 - You Are Mine;
- 8 - Gift of Finest Wheat;
- 9 - They'll Know We Are Christians;
- 10 - Digo "Si," Senor/I Say "Yes," Lord;
- 11 - Refiner's Fire (Purify My Heart);
- 12 - My Glorious;
- 13 - I Could Sing of Your Love Forever (Over the Mountains and the Sea).

All seven in the group agree that the three keys to their success are love of God, love of music and patience.

Music has always been a great love in the Stawiecki household. Karolina pointed out, "We listen to the radio and play CDs everyday, especially during household chores...washing dishes, folding clothes...all that fun stuff! And, of course, we sing along to our favorite songs. Kasia added with humor, "One year, we decided to give up listening to the radio for Lent. It was the longest and most challenging Lent we ever experienced!"

A cherished remembrance never to be forgotten when singing as a group occurred when all 11 children sang "Amazing Grace" at Our Lady of Sorrows Church during a Memorial Service for Michael Daly in March 2004. Anna noted, "Michael was a close friend who had Marfan Syndrome. He passed away at age 12. Our album,

"We Remember," is dedicated in his memory."

Besides providing music at church services, 'Blest and Broken' has been involved in community events. Last year they performed a Christmas concert for the poor and homeless at the annual Christmas dinner held at the Goleta Community Center.

In the summer of 2006, they had an incredible experience of organizing and leading a week-long retreat at Divine Saviour Parish in Los Angeles for nearly 100 children. The retreat was called "Holy Summer," and included many learning activities and music designed for the children's spiritual enrichment. The program concluded with a special Children's Mass.

When asked about future goals they wish to pursue, the group expressed their desire to record more albums, including a Christmas album and an album which would feature their own original songs. They are also entertaining the idea of touring nationally.

The parents and two eldest children, Agnieszka and Kasia, were born in Szczecin, Poland. They emigrated from Poland to Austria in the fall of 1981. Karolina was born in Austria. Agnieszka explained, "My parents, two younger sisters and I immigrated to the USA in 1982. We landed at the Santa Barbara Airport on a September afternoon and have lived in the surrounding area ever since.

The remaining eight children of the Stawiecki Family were all born in the U.S.

When asked, "What is the best thing about being Polish?" without a moment's hesitation, they all exclaimed, "The food!"

Virginia voiced, "Our mom makes the best stuffed peppers and zrazy (Polish beef roulade in sour cream sauce) and our dad makes amazing naleśniki (Polish crepes). He is also a guru at the fire pit."

Their family hobbies include playing soccer, hanging out at the beach and watching movies. "We go out and play soccer a lot," states Gabriel, the youngest in the group, and the only male. "It's great. We have 11 kids in the family - the exact number needed to make a soccer team." The family also enjoys camping up north. "We've gone as far

up as Portland, Oregon, visiting sites as 'The Grotto' and Silver Falls," expressed Ivona. "But our favorite trips are to Yosemite and Lake Tahoe."

Education is very important to each of the 11 siblings.

* Agnieszka earned a BA in Liberal Studies from Westmont, has a teacher credential and MA in Education from Antioch University;

* Kasia earned a BA in English from Westmont and a JD from Santa Barbara College of Law;

* Karolina earned an AA in Photography and Graphic Design at SBCC;

* Virginia earned an AA in Liberal Studies, AA in Interior Design at SBCC;

* Anna earned an AA in Real Estate at SBCC, is a Licensed Broker and earned a BA in Biology at Westmont;

* Ivona and Gabriel earned high school diplomas;

KNIGHT OF THE MONTH

Ralph Wengler

The “Knight of the Month” title for November, 2007 goes to our Financial Secretary (FS) Brother Ralph Wengler.

The Financial Secretary's important role is underscored by the fact that he is not elected by the membership but, his appointment - upon the recommendation of the Grand Knight and Trustees - is approved by the Supreme Knight for a period of three years. His work has a direct effect on council members, his fellow officers, the state council and the Supreme Council.

The Financial Secretary's duties revolve around two key areas of council activities: financial records and membership records. The Financial Secretary collects and receives all monies that come into the council from any source. He then turns that money over to the treasurer for deposit in the council account.

One main function of the Financial Secretary is to collect money, in the form of dues, from members. He sends out billing notices before the start of the billing period and initiates retention measures to prevent members from being suspended for nonpayment of dues.

The compilation of membership records is another of the financial secretary's important roles. He must ensure, that new members sign the constitutional roll of membership at the time of their First Degree. The financial secretary also applies to the Supreme Council office for honorary and honorary life membership cards for qualified members. Besides these two major responsibilities, the Financial Secretary has several others. They include:

handling supply orders for members with the Supreme Council Supply Department; and reporting all membership/insurance transactions to the Supreme Council office in a timely and correct manner. Because the duties and responsibilities of the Financial Secretary are so varied and complex, a Financial Secretary's Handbook (#1410) and an audiovisual production is given to the Financial Secretary.

Brother Ralph, besides taking care of all the business of the Council, attends the monthly officer and business meetings and is always there to assist and answer any council questions. When I attended the state convention, I gathered resources from other participants. Many of them were past Grand Knights. One of the questions I had for them was, “What is the key to a successful council and how can a Grand Knight lead his council efficiently?” The answer was “The KEY to a successful Council is to have a Good Financial Secretary. He must be knowledgeable about at the council, state and supreme level.”

Brother Knights, this person is Brother Ralph Wengler. Not only is he a key person knowledgeable about the council at every level; but he is very active participating in many events such as the Labor Day picnic, Saint Raphael's parish picnic, LIFE TEEN dinner, Oktoberfest, August Family Social dinner. Brother Ralph oversees the events and makes sure that things run smoothly. An example of his coaching and guidance is that events must always start on time. Food must be served warm and on time and there must be plenty of it. We cannot have people waiting. Ralph cooks, serves, cleans up, sets up, guides, helps and assists. He is one of the pillars of our Council.

As you can see the (FS) position is a big commitment and responsibility to the Council which Ralph performs with excellence. This position is a three year term of service by appointment by the Supreme Knight. In addition, Ralph Wengler has held this position previously; he was the FS from 1988 until 2000. The three year term of office of the FS provides some administrative continuity as Grand Knights come and go with their relatively trivial one year service

commitment. The Financial Secretary advises the Grand Knight and the Officers on the financial health and needs of the Council.

Ralph joined Council 5300 in 1968, a year after he and his wife Cathy moved to Goleta from Connecticut with their family. John Moynihan was his sponsor. Ralph quickly became involved in the Council; he even took his 2nd and 3rd Degree Exemplifications on the same day. He served as Treasurer in Columbian year 1972-73. Ralph has served in many Officer Positions in his association with Council 5300. These have included: Chancellor 1974-75, Deputy Grand Knight 1975-76, Grand Knight 1976-77, District Deputy 1977-79 and Chapter President 1983-84. Ralph is also a 4th Degree member and is a Past Faithful Navigator. In addition, he has been the Council cook for many events. Ralph is a GREAT ROLE MODEL to all of us. Congratulations Ralph.
