

How fortunate we are to have had our Grandpa live beyond 106-years! Len Cruess was born July 28, 1904 in Waterbury, CT to Mary and Frank Cruess and outlived his 3 brothers and 3 sisters. He died July 11, just 17-days before his 107th birthday. He was only 7-years old when he began working with his father and brothers in the Frank Cruess & Sons grocery stores, Waterbury, CT, delivering food by horse and buggy. During WW I, at the age of 14, he was managing a store.

Dad married the love of his life, Cecilia Mulville. They celebrated 72 happy years together. In 1947 Mom and Dad vacationed in Santa Barbara, CA and decided it was an ideal place to raise their younger daughters, so the big move took place in 1953.

Dad enjoyed working in the meat department of Jordano's until his retirement in 1968. During these years he took Adult Education courses and graduated from high school in 1955.

After retirement came the second love of his life - golf! Every morning at 9:30 you could find him teeing off at the Encina Royale Golf Course. He holds the record of 163 holes-in-one and was still playing at the age of 104.

In the last years of his life, he made his home with his daughter Julie Mooy and granddaughter Jo Bittner and family. Dad led a regimented life with daily schedules for eating and especially for his 4 o'clock bourbon.

Our fondest memories will be his smile, the twinkle in his blue eyes and his valued Irish heritage. His witty remarks always provided family and friends with a good laugh. When asked about the secret to his longevity, his favorite response was, "Keep your bowels open and your mouth shut." One of his proudest accomplishments was his 88-year membership in the Knights of Columbus.

Our Dad was a loving father to all of us and our loss is overwhelming. He is survived by four daughters, Julie Mooy from Santa Barbara, Mary Anne Wolbert (Robert) from Sun City West, AZ, Lenne Grant (Gerald) from Buellton, CA and Kiki Cruess from Medford, OR, plus 19 grandchildren, 41 great grandchildren and 2 great-great granddaughters. There are many families of nieces and nephews scattered throughout the U.S. He is predeceased by his wife Cecilia, sons James and John, daughter Patricia, granddaughter Jane Mooy, grandson P. J. Valentine and son-in-law Len Mooy.

Company Using Aborted Fetal Cells in Flavors
Shields Partners

As found in LifeNews.com

The company that was found to be testing their food additives using fetal cells from abortions is now working to hide the names of the corporations it contracts with as a pro-life boycott continues.

LifeNews.com reported on the controversy in March when information came to light showing Biotech Company Senomyx was found to be testing their food additives using fetal cells from a line based on cells from a baby victimized by abortion. Senomyx ignored a letter from the pro-life group Children of God for Life, which complained about its practices.

Now, the pro-life group informs Lifenews.com that Senomyx is attempting to hide the names of their corporate partners by removing them from their website.

Public backlash has apparently caused much consternation for the biomedical firm that has ignored consumer complaints and continues to use HEK-293 (human embryonic kidney) cells in the research and development of artificial flavor enhancers, says Debi Vinnedge, executive director of CGL.

The move by Senomyx comes after PepsiCo, one of the biggest corporate partners, ignored pro-life criticism in a canned recent response to customer letters, saying, "With respect to the flavor discovery research with Senomyx, we utilize techniques that have been the gold standard for several decades.

If this gold standard is no big deal, then why are they trying so hard to hide the truth? asked Vinnedge. PepsiCo and Senomyx have done everything in their power to trivialize what they are doing, when in fact what they are doing is only further damaging their public image.

Brendan Vallier Earns Eagle Scout Ranking, Total of 4 Troop 105 Scouts Honored This Year

Brendan Ryan Vallier becomes the 4th member of Boy Scout Troop 105 to be awarded the Eagle Scout Rank in the past 12 months. The Los Padres Council Eagle Review Board approved of Brendan's special project on October 28.

Only four percent of Scouts attain the Rank of Eagle which requires 21 merit badges and a leadership project that provides a permanent improvement to the community at completion. Brendan has earned 23 merit badges.

Scoutmaster Glenn Schiferl pointed out that Brendan is the 53rd Scout in the 44-year history of Troop 105 to gain this honor. Schiferl expressed, "This has been a productive year for the troop, with four boys attaining Eagle. (see photo of the 4 on page 13.) We had five boys advance to Eagle in 2007-08. The projects these young men complete directly benefit our community and the parish, as well as providing recognition for the boys, the Scouting program and our sponsors, Knights of Columbus, Goleta Valley Council 5300. Brendan's project was at a public school, which gave him added complexity in dealing with regulations and bureaucracy."

Brendan stated, "My Eagle Scout project was to build an arbor for Isla Vista Elementary School. It was to allow parents that crowded the parking lot in their cars a place to park and to sit and wait for the children to get out." He added, "It took me 3-weeks time (mostly just waiting for the cement to dry) and about \$30 for the entire project. All the wood for the arbor was generously donated by Tri-County Lumber Company and my scout troop helped me set the project up."

Total time spent on the project was 110-hours of work including meeting with the principal and designer and going around trying to find the materials. He acknowledged, "We ran into three different water pipes while digging for the arbor posts, so we had to move the original spot over three times before we had a good place to dig."



Brendan explained, "The Review Board questioned what my project was and how I went about finding aid and materials for the project, then they went over what it meant to me being a Scout and how I could continue to help give back to the younger Scouts. It was basically them learning about me and seeing how I got to this point and what I had learned."

The Dos Pueblos High School June graduate plans to attend SBCC and next year to study abroad in Spain. He joined the Boy Scouts in 2002 to go hiking and to make friends with Troop 217. He then went to Troop 60 and recently to Troop 105.

"The one event at a Boy Scout Program that stands out as a cherished remembrance never to be forgotten was when I went hiking to Philmont Scout Camp in New Mexico for a week," stated Brendan. He added, "My seven close friends went hiking straight through the valleys and hills. We covered 80-miles in one week."

The 18-year old native of Santa Barbara (born October 22, 1992) exclaimed, "Other boys and girls should consider becoming a Scout as it is a great way to make friends, learn many survival tactics and instincts that can help in dangerous situations and regular day life."

"I hope to volunteer when I have the chance and give back to the Boy Scouts," noted Brendan. He would like to see the Scouts undertake more self-run troop activities.

Brendan's parents, Kevin Cheesman and Ann Meckelborg, are proud also of their three daughters.

Asked about his hobbies, Brendan said, "I box, work with black and white film photography, play basketball, soccer, beach volleyball and hang with friends."


