



Steve brought me Holy Communion every Sunday promptly between 2:30 and 3 p.m."

"The best thing about being St. Raphael's parishioners is seeing so many friendly people," exclaimed the Sternots. In their 39-years as members of the parish, the most memorable events were the Centennial Celebrations held in 1996 and being a part of the 324-page Centennial Yearbook.

The Sternots are proud parents of daughter Delores, born May 29, 1939. "We enjoy her being around. She schedules doctor appointments and gets us to them and she reads and answers all our mail that we don't understand," boasted John who was born October 2, 1912. Delores said, "It's so neat and interesting to listen to them reminiscing about their early years on the farmlands in Wisconsin.

Travels have taken them to 49 states except Alaska, to Canada several times, and into Mexico from Arizona, California and Texas and back to Wisconsin many times.

He attended schools in Park Falls before joining the Air Force to serve in the Korean War. In 1973 Ray was transferred to Santa Barbara to continue working for General Motors for a total of 30-years until his retirement in 1991.

The Green Bay Packers winning their last Super Bowl championship was a highlight during his hospital stays.

Ray's selfless giving made him many friends and could always brighten what at other time could be a difficult time.

They and four of their eight children moved from Milwaukee in 1972 when Joe was transferred from AC Electronics to Delco Electronics in Santa Barbara. Joe retired as the Chief Draftsman from Delco in March 1983 with 35-years with General Motors.

Meitz had the privilege of running the Olympics for six years with many Knights participating to assist the 300 to 400 Special Olympians involved in all the field events including wheelchair races.

Joe's greatest personal moment as a KC member was delivering Christmas food on Christmas Eve to Poor Families in the community.

Audrey had been associated with the Women's Auxiliary, Rosary Makers and the Women's Bowling League.

Joe also has been an Elks Lodge member for 38 years and participated in the Elks Bowling League.

Hobbies have included bowling for 40-years (high score 276), building grandfather clocks from kits and small wood working items.

During World War II, Meitz served in the Air Force as a radioman/gunner on a B-17 (Flying Fortress) stationed in England at Kimbolton with the 379th Bomb Group, 527th Squadron. He pointed out, "I flew 32 missions, the last one July 18, 1944. All of our crew were awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for completing our required number of missions."

In their retirement they did a lot of traveling (Mexico, England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, Germany, Austria, Spain, Italy, Jamaica, Alaska, Hawaii, Canada and many U.S. states. Now they enjoy their family and life in beautiful Santa Barbara.



Catholic Bishops Act on Komen Foundation's Link to Planned Parenthood

(Washington, D.C.) — Roman Catholic bishops in Ohio have ordered a ban on raising funds in their dioceses' institutions for a leading foundation that battles against breast cancer—Susan G. Komen for the Cure. The decision began making pro-life news on the heels of American Life League releasing its third research report last week revealing that 18 Komen affiliates gave more than half a million dollars in grants to Planned Parenthood in 2010.

“Our latest year figures show that Komen is hurting its own mission cancer. E-Not only is Planned Parenthood the world's largest abortion chain, it is also the largest purveyor of hormonal contraceptives, which are classified by the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC)—part of the UN's World Health Organization—as Group 1 carcinogens for breast and other cancers,” said Judie Brown, president of American Life League.



“On behalf of ALL and Catholics everywhere, we thank our Church leaders in Ohio for boldly taking a stand for life. We hope that this action may provide enough clarity to leadership at Komen to prompt its administration to disentangle its fine efforts from a destructive relationship with Planned Parenthood,” Brown continued. “We also pray that such courage and discernment will embolden other Catholic bishops to act.”


